# CADDO MOUNDS

More than 1,200 years ago, Caddo Indians known as the Hasinai built a village and ceremonial center for the great Mound Builders on the prairie overlooking the Neches River. Today, three earthen mounds still rise from the Pineywoods landscape. Discover the everyday life of the Caddo people through exhibits and displays; view the mounds used for burials, religious ceremonies, and a temple; and explore the history of this ancient site.
