The Standard scoring system assesses all non-emergency grant requests. Emergency grant requests are considered for courthouses that have not yet been restored and those previously restored using a past full restoration grant. A limited number of scoring criteria are used to evaluate emergency projects for non-restored courthouses while 14 criteria are used to evaluate emergency projects for a previously restored courthouse.
