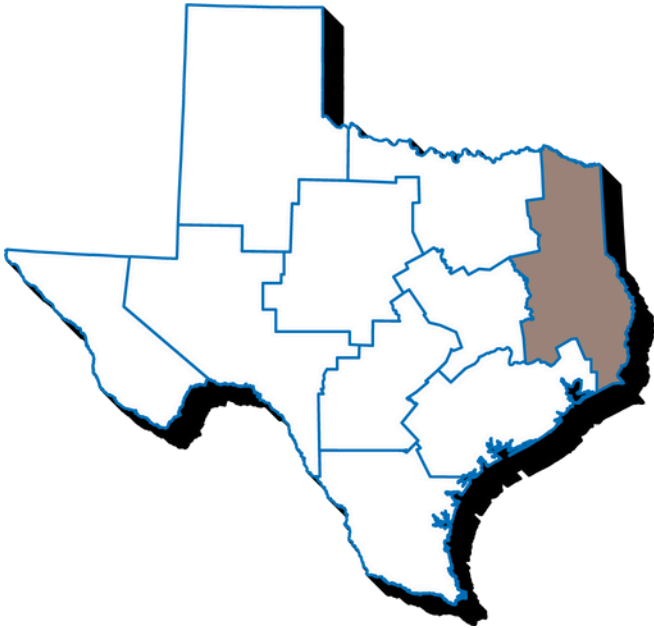


# Texas FOREST TRAIL REGION Economic Impact



The 35-county Texas Forest Trail Region features rich heritage, rich culture, and unforgettable history, including four Texas Historical Commission state historic sites.

Travel and tourism are vital to the Texas economy, and the Forest Trail Region is no exception. In 2024, direct travel spending in the Forest Trail Region accounted for roughly \$4.4 billion of the overall \$97.5 billion spent by visitors to the state.

Visiting historic sites, communities, and museums is a significant component of the state's and region's travel industry. A 2015 study by The University of Texas at Austin and Rutgers University determined that more than 10.5 percent of all travel in Texas is heritage-related.

Following devastating declines due to the pandemic, the Texas travel industry continues its rebound in 2024. Travel spending increased an estimated 3.5% compared to the prior year, and all economic indicators now exceed the pre-pandemic level.
